The Revd. Robert Findlay's mother was BARBARA HODGERT, and in 1745 he married Miss Annabeua Paterson whose mother was ANNABELLA HODGERT, one of Barbara's sisters. The following shows their ancestry as tabulated in various places in the Red Book, and now brought together.

HODGERT (Red Book p. 179).

(pencil note: See Glasgow Protocol Vol.7, p.35, 36). Referring to pages 5, 12, 16 and 39, I am indebted to Alexander Gray Buchanan for the following information. His Letters are deposited in my Deed box. I think we may fairly assume that the first mentioned in the Glasgow Commissary records, James Hogiszaird, was father of the first Robert, from whom our line evidently descends, and all the more, as Robert called his eldest son James according to old Scottish custom. Indeed it appears l think probable that he was the Ancestor of all those mentioned in the commisary records etc., although it is impossible to give a complete statement of their respective relationships. An inspection of dates etc. will show that he alone of all those mentioned could have been the Common Ancestor of this old and respectable Glasgow family Pencil note: z = y in old Scotch.

Revd. Robert Hodgert (Hodgeheard) a minister in Galloway, 3rd. Jan. 1673. Graduate (Magister) of the University of Glasgow in the records of which his name, with various

spellings, frequently appears (see AGB's letters). There can be little doubt that he was identical with Robert Hogsherd (see marginal note page 5) and must

have died before above date.

BLAIR of that UK (Red Book p. 10).

"The Craigie Arms being impaled with those of Blair in their achievements which are yet to be seen over the main door of the house of Blair (dated)"-Paterson.

William de Blair, mentioned in contracts between Ralph de Eglintoun and town of Irvine, 1205. Said to have died in reign of Alexander I between 1214 and 1249.

William de Blair, styled of that Uk in charter of Alexander III to the Abbey of Dunfermline about 1260.

Sir Bryce de Blair, who joined Wallace and was taken prisoner by the English and was executed at Ayr, 1296. He left no issue and was succeeded by his brother.

David de Blair, who submitted to Edward I, 1296.

In "Critical remarks on the Ragman's Roll" he is specially mentioned as progenitor of this family. Roger de Blair, who was a steady adherent of Robert the Bruce and died in the reign of David II.

James, who got a grant of several tenenments of land in the vicinity of Ayr which had fallen into the king's hands by forfeiture.

James, who got a charter from Robert II dated 8th May 1375, confirming a charter granted to his father by David II. He died in reign of James II David

John who had a charter from James III Johanni Blair de Eadem nepoti et hacredi Jacobi etc. terrarum Baroniae de Blair etc.

John = Elisabeth Montgomerie, daughter of Hugh 1st Earl of Eglinton.

Joh \bar{n} \approx Margaret, daughter of William Cunninghame of Glengarnock. He died about 1570.

John = Grizel, daughter of Robert 3rd Lord Semphill. (page 53).

Thomas = Isabell, sole child of Wm. Glen of Barr. Bryce Annabella, daughter of Wallace of Craigie
