



The Marriage of Alexander Stewart Duke of Albany and Catherine Sinclair was dissolved by decree of John Oterburn, official of Lothian, on the grounds of propositivity, on 2 March 1477/78, which decree was ratified by Act of Parliament 14 November 1516 (Acts, Parl. Scot. 8. 283 and 388). Their son Alexander Stuart, later Bishop of Moray was declared illegitimate, and his descendants ineligible to succeed to the Scottish crown.
